What is Phi Theta Kappa?

Phi Theta Kappa is the International Honor Society founded in 1918 for outstanding two-year college students. Kapi'olani Community College's chapter, **Alpha Kappa Psi**, is one of more than 1,200 chapters in the United States, Canada, Germany, and Japan. Alpha Kappa Psi has gained recognition by being named one of the 6 most distinguished chapters in the society in 1999-2000 and 2000-2001 and winning many regional and international awards in 2002-2004.

Who can join Phi Theta Kappa?

To be eligible for membership in the Kapi'olani Community College Chapter, a student must:

- 1. Have a cumulative GPA of 3.5 and 12 credits of coursework at 100 level or above (English and Math courses numbered below 100 do not count toward the total number of credits or the GPA for eligibility.)
- 2. Meet requirements of the Phi Theta Kappa International Constitution (available at http://www.ptk.org/) by establishing a record of "academic excellence" and being "of good moral character" by submitting faculty recommendation forms (provided in the application).
- 3. Be enrolled at Kapi'iolani Community College in at least one course for credit.
- 4. Pay \$95 for the appropriate one-time fees:
 - \$55 International lifetime membership fee
 - \$10 Regional membership fee
 - \$30 Chapter fee
 - \$95 Total one-time fees

What if you don't meet all membership requirements?

Kapi'iolani Community College's chapter welcomes as *Provisional Members*, new students who belonged to a high school honor society, transfer students who maintained a 3.5+ GPA at other colleges, or Kapi'iolani Community College students with a 3.5 GPA who have completed between 6 and 11 credits. Provisional Members may take part in activities at the chapter level during their provisional membership.

Why join Phi Theta Kappa?

Phi Theta Kappa membership earns you numerous benefits:



RECOGNITION OF ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE: At Kapi'olani Community College, those maintaining active standing will be recognized for academic excellence. Phi Theta Kappa graduates wear distinctive gold stoles and tassels at graduation and receive a special seal for their diplomas.



FINANCIAL AID: Many scholarships and grant applications add points for membership in Phi Theta Kappa and additional points for serving as an officer. Many four-year colleges have partial or full tuition scholarships designated for Phi Theta Kappa members only.



PREFERENCE IN COLLEGE APPLICATIONS: Phi Theta Kappa membership helps in getting accepted to four-year colleges.



OPPORTUNITY TO BUILD RÉSUMÉ: Through leadership roles, community service, and participation in a variety of activities, students develop impressive records that enhance applications for scholarships, universities, and jobs.



PERSONAL ENRICHMENT: Members develop friendships with other honor students at Kapi'olani Community College and nationwide. Opportunities for travel to national and regional conferences are available.

What is expected of Phi Theta Kappans?

Once inducted, members are required to do the following:

- 1. Continuously strive for "academic excellence", including maintaining a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher and continuing to be of "good moral character".
- 2. Be enrolled in at least one course for credit during each semester of membership.
- 3. Support the chapter to the extent that they are able. All members are highly encouraged but not required to participate in chapter activities, such as:
 - General membership meetings
 - Fundraisers and special events
 - Chapter service projects (campus and community)
 - Future inductions of new members

How can you join Phi Theta Kappa?

If you meet the eligibility requirements for the program, submit the following:

- ✓ Complete application form for Phi Theta Kappa.
- ✓ Print a copy of your transcripts
 - ➤ Go to MyUH portal
 - Click on Star Degree Check/View Transcript on left
 - Click on *Transcript/Campus* at the top
 - ➤ Select option for *Campus transcripts BY SEMESTER*
 - Click on PDF button option to print
- ✓ **Drop off completed application, transcripts, and payment at 'Iliahi 231, office 11**. Look for the Phi Theta Kappa sign on the gray cubicle on the left.
- ✓ If possible, attend an orientation meeting for new members to receive additional information.
